

What is Specialist Disability Support in Schools?

Our **Specialist Disability Support in Schools** (SDSS) program provides support for primary and secondary school students who require substantial educational adjustments to help them access, participate and achieve at school.

What can this service help me with?

The SDSS Team has a Speech Pathologist, Occupational Therapist and Psychologist to help students with their big feelings, communication and the skills needed to complete school work and interact with their friends.

How does it work?

Our therapists will work with you, your child and their school support team to understand what their needs are and how to best support your child at school.

Often this looks like:

- ♥ Initial meeting (gathering of information)
- ♥ In-class observations
- ♥ Assessment
- ♥ Goal planning
- ♥ Individual or group sessions designed to meet your child's goals
- ♥ Progress Review Meeting
- ♥ Celebrating achievements

How long can we get support for?

Each term your child's goals will be reviewed to determine if more support is needed.

How often will we see our child's therapist?

Our therapists will visit your child at school weekly or fortnightly and will be in contact with you by phone or email to keep you informed of their progress.

Where do we meet?

Meetings and therapy sessions will occur at school.
